1. <u>Pay Hall</u>. The pay Hall is virtually finished. The only items now outstanding are for figing the ornamental Woodwork; the predestal for the bust (which is not yet quite finished) and the balance of Me Noble's account The bust is quite ready to be placed when the pedestal is polished. 2. Accountants Bank note Office. the removal of the Stamping Machine has left a blank space in the office, and the change of fittings consequent on this are not yet decided on, otherwise the office is compate. 3. Printing Department. This work which included the building and fitting up of a third Stovey over certain rooms in the Printing Department, and removing thereto all the Alereotype plates and implements for Dividend Warrand printing, which had been placed about the Bank in various vantts, has now been grite finished. The whole work has been done since February, and the total cost has been \$9405.

4. Parages & Obbies.
